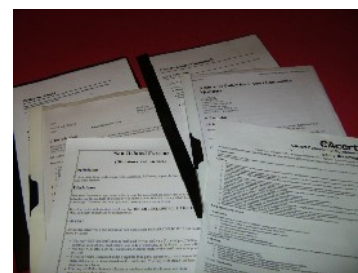

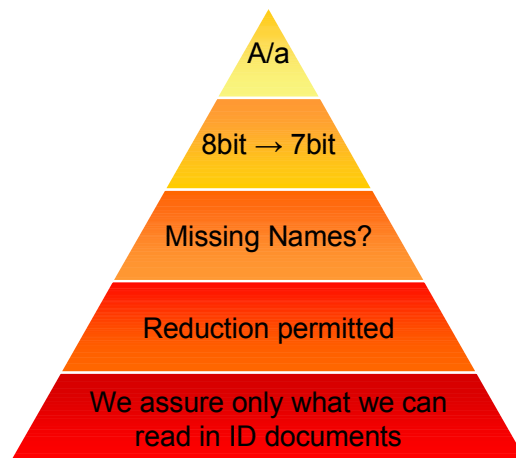

- **Assuree's Part (Applicant)**
 - Names as in ID doc, see. *Names-Rules*
 - Date of Birth a.) D->D, M->M, Y->Y b.) 01 → 10 c.) 09 → Sep
 - Primary Email Ask for account and primary Email
 - CCA Acceptance Attention on "old" CAP forms
(PoJAM: parental consent exists)
 - Request for Assurance Privacy purpose
 - Date of Assurance Optional check against newer documents
 - Signature
- **Assurer's Part**
 - Name of Assurer
 - Assurance Points
 - Assurance-Statement
 - Date
 - Location of Assurance
 - Signature
- Accepted documents Optional - Essential for Evidence Gathering

CACert Community Agreement (R/L/O)

Agreement of the members

- Risks** : You may find yourself subject into Arbitration 
- Liabilities** : Liabilities limited to 1000 Euro 
- Obligations** : Keep your Email Address in a good working order
(→ Check Account exists, primary Email Adress) 

File a Dispute

- Data of the member (Name, primary Email)
- Acceptance to CCA and DRP
- CARS (CACert Assurer Reliable Statement)
